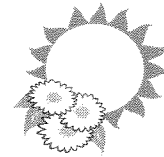

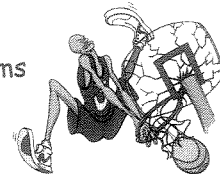

## NEW SAFETY I.D. BADGES

On Tuesday, January 18th, every student will be issued an I.D. badge. It is important that the badge be worn at all times during normal school hours.

This additional safety step will help keep your child safe while at school. It will not only help with knowing if we have non-students on campus; but in emergency situations, every student could be identified by any staff member or by law enforcement or fire personnel.

The badges are very durable, but students who lose or destroy their badges will be accountable for the cost of replacing them.

## Help Children Learn Good Character Traits



**D**eveloping the “good” in children is what we call developing their character. We know that a child’s character develops in many ways, but the most important influence is parents at home.

**Try these ideas to build your child’s character:**

- Spend time with your child. He can learn just by talking with you.
- Become an “askable” parent. Be willing to talk about anything with your child.
- Talk with your child about making decisions. Discuss decisions he might have to make at school or with his friends. Would he lie or cheat on a test?
- Encourage your child to give to others. Teach him to know the right thing to do, even if it’s not something he wants to do.



- Limit the number of hours your child watches TV. Monitor what he watches, and talk about the characters’ decisions.

The time you spend developing your child’s character now will pay off the rest of his life.
