Dear Brittan Families,

I hope you and your families are doing well. I know that this is a very unsettling time for everyone. I want to start by thanking all of you for your patience as we work through the reopening protocols for Brittan School District.

At this time Brittan School District is planning on opening in the fall with students attending 5 days a week. As a school we will be adjusting our protocols and practices to be in line with State and Federal guidelines. Please understand that these are a starting point and that the guidelines could change as the pandemic situation changes.

Below are some of the changes we will be making in order for us to meet the current guidelines. Again, this is just a starting point and more detailed information will be shared in the next few weeks.

Campus Changes for the Reopening of the 2020-2021 School Year:

1. Health and safety practices and protocols will be in place, including hand washing, social distancing, and appropriate face coverings if requested or mandated.
2. Passive Health Screening for students will be conducted daily for symptoms. Parents will be instructed to screen students before leaving for school, check temperature to ensure temperature is below 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, and observe for symptoms. Keep students at home if they have symptoms consistent with COVID-19 or if they have had close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19. Staff and students who are sick are expected to stay home.
3. Reducing bus routes to minimize the number of students on the bus at one time.
4. Reconfiguration of classrooms to ensure the maximum distance possible between student desks.
5. Arrival time between 8:00-8:15 with students going directly to their classrooms.
6. Breakfast will be served in the classroom.
7. Recess and lunch will be strategically coordinated to ensure proper spacing of students on the playground and in the cafeteria.
8. Meals will be served individually plated or bagged.
9. Sharing of supplies, manipulatives, toys, sports equipment, and other learning and recreational materials will be limited and each student will have separate individually labeled boxes or cubbies.
10. Distance Learning will be offered as an instructional option. The Distance Learning model will be using onsite curriculum and lessons will be provided by the grade level teacher thru Google Classroom.
